

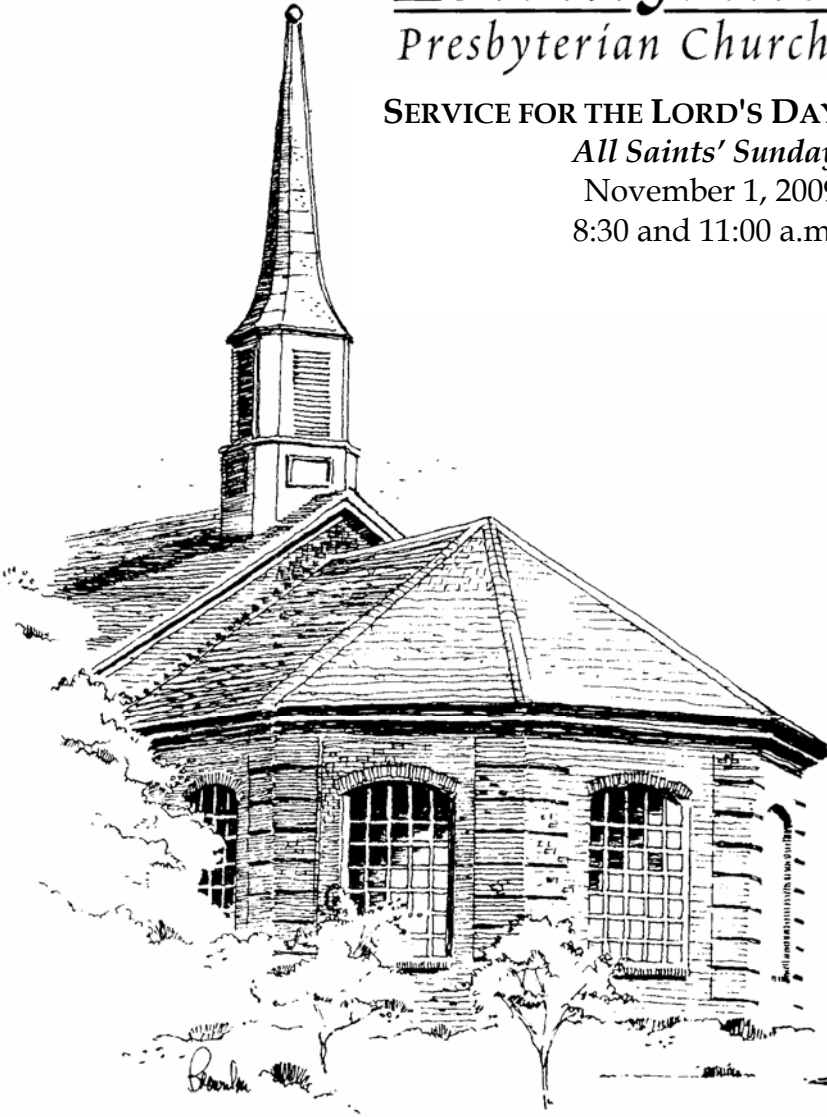

8:30 - During the Lord's Supper, you are invited to serve the bread and wine to one another in the pews. You can use the words, "The Body of Christ" or "The Bread of Life" for the bread and "The Blood of Christ" or "The Cup of the New Covenant" for the wine, or another appropriate greeting. The elements being served during our communion service include wine in the outer ring and grape juice in the inner rings. Gluten free bread will be available from the servers.

11:00 - Communion will be served using intinction. Ushers will indicate when each pew is to come forward to receive the bread and cup. After receiving the bread, please dip it into the chalice to receive the wine (grape juice). A third station is gluten free and indicated by the green chalice. After receiving the bread and cup, you may return to your pew using the side aisles. Those not desiring or unable to come forward may so indicate to the ushers, and the bread and cup will be brought to the pew so all may partake.

Something to think about . . .

At the end we meet not an event, but a Person. God is not one final 'item' in the new Jerusalem; God is himself the eschatological reality who embraces all things. "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end." *Revelation 21:6a*.

CHILDREN AND THE LORD'S SUPPER

Today you'll notice that the children are not served grapes during the celebration of the

Lord's Supper. More than a generation ago, Presbyterians began welcoming all baptized children to the Lord's Table. Here's what our Book of Order says, "Baptized children who are being nurtured and instructed in the significance of the invitation to the Table and the meaning of their response are invited to receive the Lord's Supper, recognizing that their understanding of participation will vary according to their maturity." W-2.4011b At Lewinsville Presbyterian Church, we welcome all baptized persons to receive the Lord's Supper.

Children come to Lord's Supper in many different stages of readiness. We who are adult cannot know the depth or sincerity of their faith, just as we cannot know the depth or sincerity of anyone's faith. That children have faith is amply demonstrated in their relationships with others and in what they say about God and about Jesus and his love for them. The faith of children is demonstrated in the questions they ask. The lives of Lewinsville's children, indeed, the life of our whole congregation will be enriched through their participation in the worship and sacramental life of the church. Children are encouraged to receive the bread and cup.
