

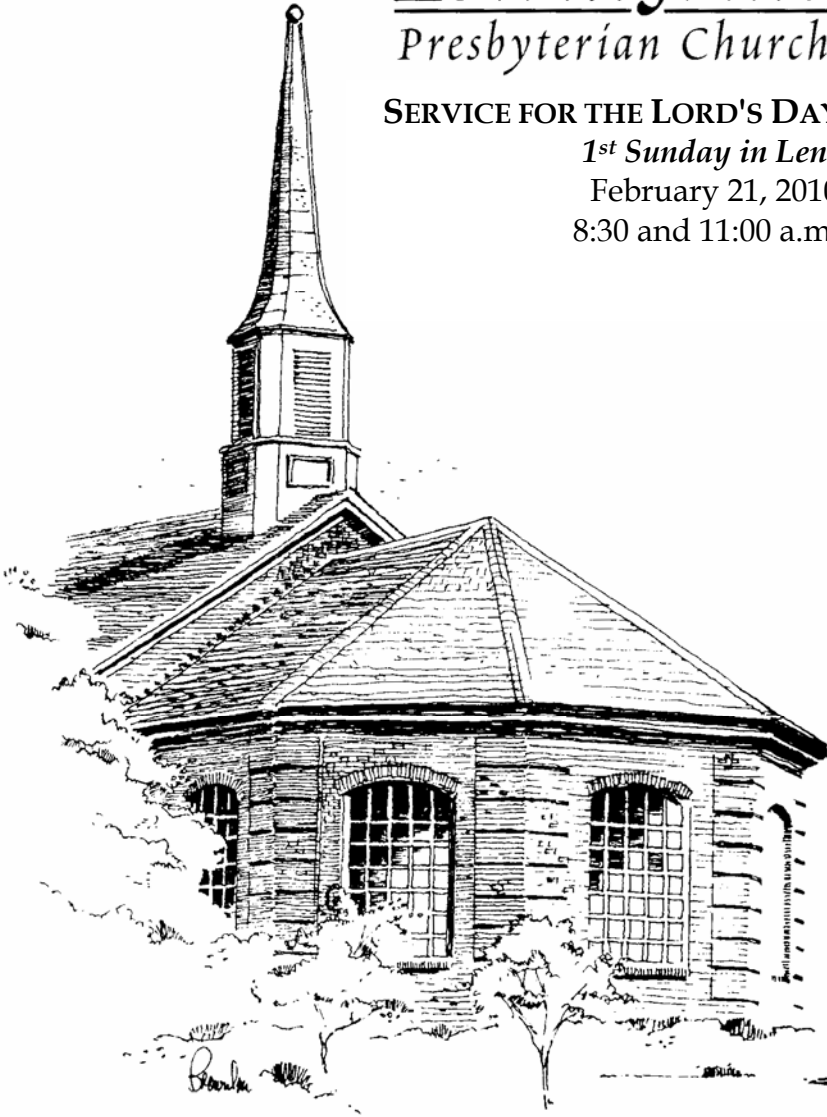

8:30 - Communion will be served using intinction. Ushers will indicate when each pew is to come forward to receive the bread and cup. After receiving the bread, please dip it into the chalice to receive the wine (grape juice). A third station is gluten free and indicated by the green chalice. After receiving the bread and cup, you may return to your pew using the side aisles. Those not desiring or unable to come forward may so indicate to the ushers, and the bread and cup will be brought to the pew so all may partake.

11:00 - During the Lord's Supper, you are invited to serve the bread and wine to one another in the pews. You can use the words, "The Body of Christ" or "The Bread of Life" for the bread and "The Blood of Christ" or "The Cup of the New Covenant" for the wine, or another appropriate greeting. The elements being served during our communion service include wine in the outer ring and grape juice in the inner rings. Gluten free bread will be available from the servers.

MISSION OF THE MONTH

30 Hour Famine

“Jesus said: Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such of these.”

Matt, 19:14

Every day, thousands of children die from hunger and hunger-related diseases. The good news is that world hunger is 100 percent preventable. If we choose to stand up for hungry children everywhere – if we show our compassion, faith and desire for change – we can reverse these numbers. In fact, if you choose to make a difference in the life of *just one child*, you will have already begun to change our world.

That is the choice Lewinsville youth are making by participating in the 30 Hour Famine. In an act of extreme fellowship, our youth will experience the pain of hunger for themselves by fasting for 30 hours, starting Friday night **February 26, 2010**. The result, however, is more than just heightened awareness. It is to make a difference in the lives of the children suffering from hunger and hunger-related diseases.

Let us, as congregants of Lewinsville Church, be obedient to our Lord and Savior by praying that the mission will be to the glory of the Lord Jesus Christ and for the children who are suffering. We can also assist by helping with needed supplies, which will be collected so the youth participating in the 30 hour famine can participate in the sandwich-making project. The aim of the sandwich-making project will be to make sandwiches for a nearby shelter.

Supplies are being collected in the box in the volunteer room. Enough supplies for 20 youth to make five bagged meals are needed. Supplies include:

*Bread, lunch meat (ham, turkey), juice boxes,
water, cookies, individual snacks, pieces of fruit,
individual bags of chips,
empty copier paper boxes and plastic bags.*

PHILIP CHURCH

Phil Church, along with his wife, Connie, is a 26-year member of Lewinsville Presbyterian Church. He is a former elder of the class of 2001 when he served on the Stewardship Committee and the earlier Church in the World Committees. Phil served overseas in Latin America and Asia as a foreign service economics officer. He is a graduate of the University of Chicago and holds a PhD. in Economics from the University of Oregon. He continues active in socio-economic development work focusing on support to government and non-government initiatives in the eradication of human trafficking and exploitive child labor. Phil currently serves as Lewinsville's representative to the Virginia Interfaith Center for Public Policy and the Presbyterian Hunger Committee and also is active with other church members in Lewinsville's Faith and Public Policy breakfasts.

HARRIET NELDON

Harriet and Rick Neldon live in McLean with their 3 children: Jane, Richard, and Alice. They have been active members since 1996. Harriet was raised and nurtured in a Presbyterian family and church in Tarboro, NC. After graduating from Mary Baldwin College, Harriet moved to Arlington, VA, and was employed by the American Petroleum Institute in Washington, DC, for 23 years. Harriet joined Church of the Pilgrims in Washington, DC, where she met Rick in the church choir. During her 19 years at Pilgrims she served on numerous committees.
