

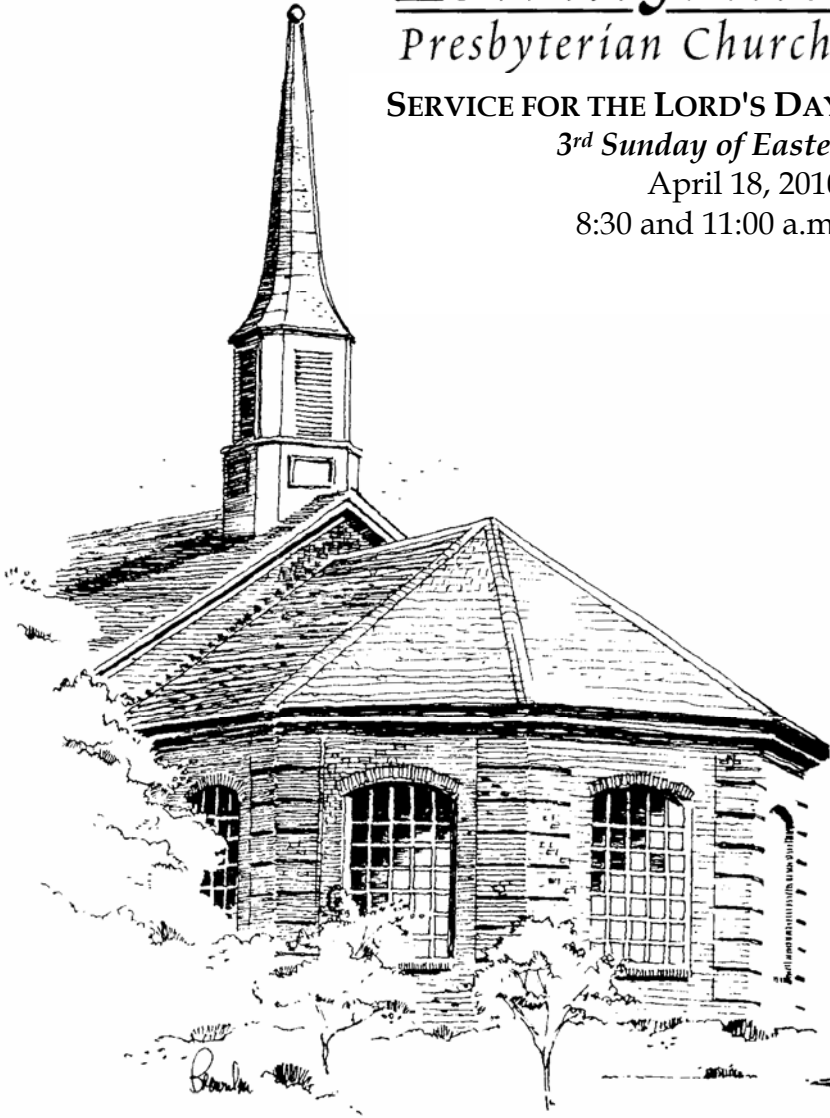

SUMMER MISSION PROJECT - As announced in the April newsletter, our Summer Mission Project team will be going to Texas City (just outside of Houston) in June to help Presbyterian Disaster Assistance with the rebuilding efforts remaining from Hurricane Ike which hit that area in September 2008. In an effort to involve more folks outside the congregation in our fundraising this year, all were asked to collect a minimum of \$300 in sponsorships by April 1 (in lieu of the normal registration fee). - Improve the safety and usability of the bathroom with grab bars, caulking, and a hand held shower.

Topic: A Discussion on Faith and Public Policy

Our speaker will be

Rep. Gerry Connolly, D-VA

U.S. House of Representatives from the 11th Congressional District

Our local representative to the U.S. Congress, representing parts of Fairfax County, Prince William County, and the City of Fairfax, will share with us his perspectives on the interface between faith and the many issues that he deals with in the House of Representatives. There will be time for questions and discussion.

Congressman Connolly serves on the House Budget Committee, the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, and the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform. Recently, he was elected President of the freshman class in the U.S. House of Representatives. He was elected to Congress in 2008, and plans to run again for the Democratic Party this November.

In addition to his current role on the national scene, Gerry is well known in Northern Virginia as the recent Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County, where he was

known as a strong proponent of environmental stewardship, affordable housing, public safety, transit-oriented development, regional cooperation, and gang prevention. After earning a B.A. in Literature from Maryknoll College, a Catholic Seminary in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, and a M.A. in Public Administration from Harvard University, he worked 10 years on the staff of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.
