

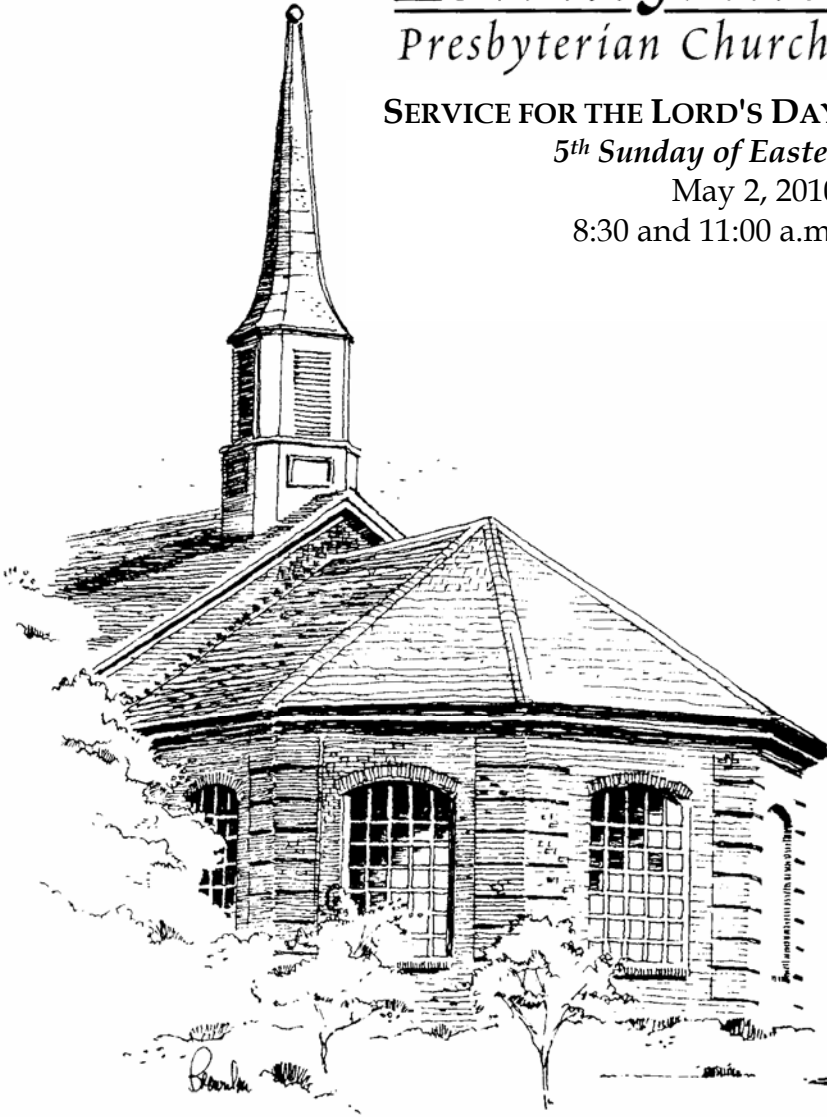

SILVER TEA INVITATION - Everyone is cordially invited to attend The 104th Annual Silver Tea and Light Luncheon at Ingleside at Rock Creek, **TODAY** from 1:00 to 3:00 PM. (3050 Military Rd NW, Washington, DC). Every year since the founding of the Presbyterian Home of the District of Columbia, now known as Ingleside at Rock Creek, dedicated members of the Ingleside Women's Board have held a Tea to benefit residents in need. The Silver Tea takes place each year on the first Sunday in May. It is a social gathering of residents, family, friends and benefactors of Ingleside.
