Well, Lewinsville friends, let us test your memory! In September 2009, we celebrated Verna Chenault's 20th year as a staff member at Lewinsville. First working on a part-time basis, Verna had become a full-time staffer in January of 2004. So we wrote an article for our Newsletter that September to share with you many aspects of her life: where she came from (England); when she moved to the United States (1981); the date when she first attended our church (1987); what constituted her family (two daughters: Sara, a veterinarian in Richmond, Virginia and has three daughters and her sister Anna, a pediatric speech therapist in Chicago who has two girls and two boys – wow!); and finally, when she and long-time Lewinsville member Bill Chenault were joined in matrimony by Pastor Emily (October of 2008). And, in that same Newsletter, we learned a great deal about what Verna's role was in the "front office." For many of you, these facts ring some bells, right?

So why this article? Because we want both to refresh your memories a bit about her life as a church staffer and to let you in on what may happen in her life next year. And why now? **Because Verna will retire at the end of January, 2012!** Her departure as a staffer will be a huge loss for this church, so we want to remind you about her role during these last 22 years and share with you some of what she plans to do after her retirement.

First a brief reminder of *some* of her office tasks: meeting and greeting visitors to the church; answering the busy telephone; typing the weekly Sunday bulletin; preparing the monthly Newsletter; recording and keeping track of visitors; maintaining up-to-date records of church activities; being the "office proof reader;" and—as noted in the earlier Newsletter—"performed other secretarial functions as required!" And, on top of all this, Verna was a church school teacher for three years and served on the Flower Committee for 20 years. All of these functions/tasks were performed in a professional, gracious, and caring way which benefited all of us at Lewinsville Church

So what's next for Verna? Well, her hobbies include biking, walking, traveling and gardening, and now there will be more time for these. And this "post-retirement spare time" will also allow her to spend more time with husband Bill, her daughters, and her seven grandchildren as well as time to visit three siblings, their families, and old friends still living in England. She and Bill will continue to belong to the Second Saturday Set and enjoy their monthly activities. Not surprisingly, we Lewinsville members will still find her around the church—albeit at different hours—continuing as part of the Flower Committee. Verna also will continue to oversee ordering and implementing supplies for special services. And, oh yes, she promises that she will work harder on putting certain "English" habits aside. For example: she'll try to remember which side of the road to drive on (the "right" side, Verna!) and she'll work both on pronunciation and usage of certain words in the (American) "English" language!

So we at Lewinsville Church have much to say to Verna. We thank you for all you have done for us and this church during your many years of service. We are delighted that you will continue to be a part of our congregation. We wish you many years of fun and rest and travel and pure enjoyment in exciting and different ways. And finally, we ask God's blessing on you and your family in the years to come.

From the Pastor . . .

We continue looking at the Statement of Discipleship, adopted by the Session in June, 2011. This month we are encouraged in the practice of faithful Christian Stewardship. You might be thinking: "WHAT?? You're going to talk about Stewardship in January? We did that in the fall!" Yes, we did. And we'll continue to talk about it – because stewardship is about life – recognizing that all of who we are and all we do and think and say is a response to God and God's presence in our lives.

We have come to equate 'stewardship' with making a financial pledge to the church. 'Stewardship' does include faithful, generous use of the financial well-being afforded us. 'Stewardship' also has to do with faithful use of the earth's resource. Do you recycle? Do you make choices in the supermarket aisle based on the packaging or solely based on convenience? Do you know your 'carbon footprint'? Have you ever thought of those actions as part of Christian discipleship?

'Stewardship' also has to do with how we use the 24 hours gifted to us each day. Do you get enough sleep each night? Many Americans are sleep deprived – because of stress, a long to-do list, insomnia, baby's needs. . . Did you ever consider getting enough sleep as good stewardship? God created our bodies and included rest and sleep in the design. If we don't get enough sleep, our brains don't function as well as they can and everything gets thrown off. How do you use your leisure time? Your work time? Your school time? Your family time? God gifts us each day with another 24 hours. Seeing each day as a gift from God and using each day as a gift from God is a discipline of the Christian life. Try it!

'Stewardship' also has to do with how we use the skills God has given us. Do we use our talents and passions mainly for ourselves, our families, our businesses, our church community, our neighborhood? How well have you pursued your passions?

All of this (and more!) is Christian stewardship. Practicing faithful stewardship is something that will draw us closer to God and consequently, closer to one another.

Along this journey, members of the Lewinsville community of faith lead dynamic, engaged lives of faith as disciples of Jesus Christ in the church and in the world.

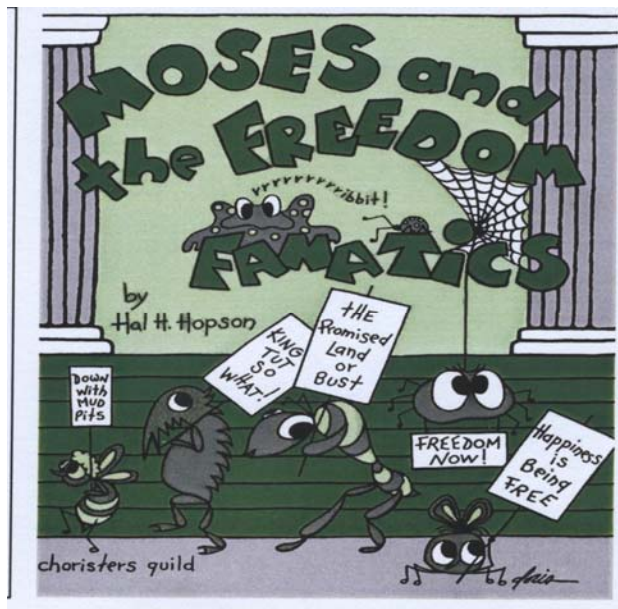
Practices that deepen that engagement and shape us on this journey are:

Christ and Culture Revisited

H. Richard Niebuhr (1894-1962), younger brother of Reinhold, taught Christian ethics for many years at Yale University. His most famous work is a book called *Christ and Culture*, which is a critical analysis of the variety of different ways in which Christians have sought to relate their faith to "worldly" affairs. Published in the 1950's, the book is today widely regarded as a classic. The purpose of this course is to reconsider the view Niebuhr advanced in that book in the light of the criticisms to which it has been subjected and contemporary developments.

Intergenerational Class: Film discussion "The Anatomy of Hate: A dialogue for hope"

The Anatomy of Hate; A Dialogue to Hope reveals the shared narratives found in individual and collective ideologies of hate, and how we as a species can overcome them. For six years the filmmaker worked with unprecedented access to some of the most venomous ideologies and violent conflicts of our time including the White Supremacist movement, Christian Fundamentalism as an anti-gay platform, Muslim Extremism, the Palestinian Intifada, Israeli Settlers and Soldiers, and US Forces in Iraq. By juxtaposing this truth filled footage with interviews from leading sociological, psychological, and neurological experts, and interspersing stories of redemption told by former "combatants", the film weaves a tapestry that reveals both the emotional and biological mechanisms which make all of us susceptible to acts and ideologies of hate, and demonstrates how these very same traits make us equally capable of overcoming them....

Looking at Immigration Issues Through the Lens of Faith

**Speaker: Kathryn M. Doan,
Executive Director of CAIR Coalition**

For over a decade, CAIR (Capital Area Immigrants' Rights) Coalition has worked collaboratively with community groups, pro bono attorneys, volunteers and immigrants from the District of Columbia, Virginia and Maryland to ensure that all immigrants are treated with fairness, dignity and respect for their human and civil rights.

Our speaker will provide a brief overview of U.S. Immigration history to put the current political debate in it's historical context and will pay particular attention to the impact of the government's current "enforcement only" policy that has led to a record number of detained immigrants with devastating effects on immigrant families and communities, and will conclude with how communities of faith are responding to these issues.

A very low income resident of the Lewinsville Retirement Residence will receive 6 months of subsidy for his/her daily meals

A Kenyan child from one of the 5 tribes living near the United Orphanage and Academy will receive a full year of education

A victim of domestic violence will receive counseling and critical support from Bethany House

Daughter Ava will be changing schools from Graham Road elementary in Falls Church to Westgate elementary next semester. They are very appreciative of the support that both Lewinsville and Immanuel Presbyterian Churches have provided since they arrived last summer. The Mission and Service Ministry group will continue to help support them into the new year, although likely at a lesser rate than we've been doing since they arrived last summer.

DIRECTOR OF MUSIC MINISTRIES UPDATE

The Director of Music Ministries Search Committee reconvened on Saturday, December 3, 2011. Members continuing on the committee are Judy Herseth, Chris Markwood, Libby McConnell, Sally McKeown, Debbie McKinley, Lisa Stucky, Amy Yurkewitch. Nancy Mitchell and Jim Scopeletis chose not to remain active on the committee.

Since January 2011, the committee has considered 106 candidates and conducted 15 telephone interviews. We brought in 6 strong candidates to interview face-to-face, which involved an organ and choir conducting audition as well as sit-down meetings with the committee and a separate interview with Debbie McKinley. Two of those candidates could not accept the position for personal reasons. We let two more candidates go over the summer. We brought two candidates back for a second round of interviews. After careful discernment, the committee chose to let those two candidates go as well. These decisions did not come easily. In each case the Committee sought to understand how these individuals would serve within the Lewinsville community of faith as well as lead the music ministry.

The committee met again on December 3rd with renewed enthusiasm. We agreed that we had all learned a great deal in the previous months through our meetings with candidates and our conversations with each other. We plan to take the first weeks in January to spend intensive time refining and expanding our thoughts about how the music ministry engages all of us in worship, interfaces and supports other ministries of the church, ministers to the community outside of Lewinsville Church, and deepens the musical and spiritual lives of choir members and participants. We are in the process of contacting an outside musical facilitator to help us in this process. With these thoughts in mind, we will revise the position description and our advertising materials before placing advertisements in February. We also plan to review previously submitted resumes, to see if there is anyone we should contact again, given our revised vision and position description.

The committee has continually sought to discern God's hand in this process. We remain committed to the idea that we have not yet found the person that God is calling to serve at Lewinsville. We also remain strongly committed to the knowledge that God is preparing that person, as God is preparing us to discern who that person is. We are approaching these next months with a sense of excitement and hope as we see God acting in our midst. Please continue to keep the Director of Music Search Committee in prayer.
