CLIMATE CHANGE: AN ALTERNATE PERSPECTIVE AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS OF VARYING VIEWS – **March 20**, 7-9 PM Chapel. All are invited to a discussion on climate change/global warming hosted by the Faith and Public Policy Group here at Lewinsville. The meeting will be moderated by Linton Brooks and will include a discussion with John Theon, Ph.D., a member here at Lewinsville, and our guest speaker, Dr. Patrick Michaels. John worked in research on weather and climate for 33 years, the last 13 of which he headed the NASA weather and climate research program. Dr. Michaels is a climatologist with a Ph. D. in ecological climatology. He served as a research professor of environmental studies from 1980 to 2007 at U. VA., is a past president of the American Association of State Climatologists and served as a US reviewer at the International Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC). He has written and reviewed several books on the topic of climate change. Currently he is a senior fellow at the Cato Institute.

The presentation will discuss whether and how varying views of the science should influence future policy. What things are worth doing regardless of which view is correct? What may prove to be unnecessary, but have no serious adverse effects? How should we approach the most difficult issues, especially those with significant social implications? What things are worth promoting as Christians, regardless of which scientific view shapes public policy? Our objective will be to illuminate how those of different perspectives can work together. Come join us in this exploration.

A New Beginning

Heritage Hall is well loved but also well worn, and in need of urgent attention. During the most recent four years, a master plan was prepared by a building task force and priorities determined for addressing the most serious inadequacies.

Scott Ramsey, our interim pastor, became our permanent pastor in the fall of 2018 with special approval of Presbytery. Unconstrained by interim status, Scott provided the leadership necessary to complete task force planning and initiate a capital campaign.

In February 2019, the Trail Blazer Capital Campaign was officially launched. One hundred-fifty attendees listened as the task force laid out extensive renovation plans. Soon after, Fairfax County agreed to our use of a special permit, originally obtained in the 1980's, to perform this renovation, saving us months of delay and great expense.

Many on the task force believe we have had a silent partner at our side throughout this process, watching over us as critical issues have been resolved in our favor.

If you feel a commitment to be involved, to help Lewinsville strengthen its ability to serve the next generation, this is the time to listen to the Spirit. Walk with us and support us as we gather the funds to create a new beginning for the physical and spiritual Lewinsville Presbyterian Church.

The Trail Blazer Capital Campaign continues its 3-year pledge campaign through June 1, 2019. Remember to return your pledge card by May 31.
