

BLACK HISTORY MONTH COMPOSERS- To honor Black History Month Lewinsville's Chancel Choir will be singing choral works of African American composers throughout the month.

Duke Ellington (1899-1974) Duke Ellington, was an American composer, pianist, and leader of a jazz orchestra, which he led from 1923 until his death over a career spanning more than six decades. Born in Washington, D.C., Ellington was based in New York City from the mid-1920s onward and gained a national profile through his orchestra's appearances at the Cotton Club in Harlem. In the 1930s, his orchestra toured in Europe. Although widely considered to have been a pivotal figure in the history of jazz, Ellington embraced the phrase "beyond category" as a liberating principle and referred to his music as part of the more general category of American Music rather than to a musical genre such as jazz. In 1965, Ellington moved into a new musical field, presenting a Concert of Sacred Music of his own composition in Grace Cathedral in San Francisco. The performance, starting with the Biblical paraphrase "In the beginning, God...", was developed in typical Ellingtonian style with a company that included his full orchestra, three choirs, dancer and several guest vocalists. Mr. Ellington considered the concert "the most important thing I've ever done." It was repeated twice in New York at the Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church in the same year. Three years later he introduced a Second Sacred Concert here at the Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine and, in 1973, a Third Sacred Concert was performed for the first time, in London at Westminster Abbey.

Moses Hogan (1957-2003) who won acclaim as an arranger of spirituals and leader of a choir that specialized in the idiom. Hogan was conductor of the Moses Hogan Chorale, a 40-member ensemble he founded in 1993 to preserve and perform African American spirituals. It was one of only two American choirs invited to sing at the 1996 World Choral Symposium in Sydney, Australia, and was the first African American choir to perform there. The chorale toured across the United States and Europe and was praised for its mesmerizing blending of voices in a vocal tradition that dated to the time of slavery. He edited the Oxford Book of Spirituals, which was published in September 2001 by Oxford University Press and became the top seller in the Oxford press' American division. Hogan, a pianist, was a graduate of the New Orleans Center for Creative Arts who also studied at the Juilliard School. His arrangements have been published by Hal Leonard Corp. and sung by performers including soprano Barbara Hendricks and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir.

Chris Ziemba is a jazz pianist, composer, and educator based on the East Coast. He holds Bachelors of Music in Jazz and Contemporary Media as well as Music Education from the Eastman School of Music, where he studied with pianists Harold Danko and Paul Hofmann. He also holds a Masters of Music in Jazz and Contemporary Media from Eastman in New York, he earned an Artist Diploma in Jazz Studies from The Juilliard School. highlights of his time in New York include performances with such renowned artists as Gil Evans Project, Kurt Elling, Carl Allen, Marcus Printup, Ron Blake, and Karrin Allyson, among others. In 2016, Ziemba released his debut album, Manhattan Lullaby. The album features his original compositions and arrangements. In 2017, Ziemba became the pianist for the Airmen of Note, the premier jazz ensemble of the United States Air Force Band based in Washington, D.C. He continues to regularly perform and record.

Eric Juberg, 25, is a New York based jazz saxophonist and clarinetist. An Indiana native, Eric recently graduated from the Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music. While there he studied saxophone with Tom Walsh, as well as acclaimed jazz clarinetist Frank Glover. Eric's past teachers also include Tom Meyer and Matt Pivec, director of jazz studies at Butler University. Eric also had the opportunity to share the stage with IU alum Randy Brecker at the JEN conference last year as part of IU's top jazz ensemble. He can be heard on "Afro Blue" off of Michael Spiro and Wayne Wallace's Grammy nominated album "Canto America." Since moving to New York Eric has performed with Paul Austerlitz, Fleur Seule, Felix Peikli, and many others. In addition to sax and clarinet, Eric spends lots of time working with wind synthesizers, specifically the Akai Electronic Wind Instrument (EWI). Some of his other interests are composing, reading, and Asian cultures.

Kevin Cerovich is a Latin Grammy nominated trombonist originally from Kansas City, Missouri. He holds a Bachelor of Music in Jazz Trombone from the University of Missouri Kansas City. Awards include the 2007 International Trombone Association's JJ Johnson Jazz Competition and the Eastern Trombone Workshop's Solo Jazz Competition. Cerovich's debut album, "The Last Spring" features his quartet playing all original compositions. Cerovich moved to New York City in 2008 and was quickly hired by jazz piano icon Eric Lewis with whom he toured internationally and recorded on the 2009 Sony Pictures soundtrack, "Dark Country." He then recorded and toured for several years with Charlelie Couture in Europe and Canada. Since 2013, Cerovich has played jazz trombone with the famed Airmen of Note, The United States Air Force Band, Washington, D.C. Before joining the Air Force, Cerovich was a member of the Charlie Persip Big Band and the National Jazz Museum in Harlem All Stars. His work with Andres Salguero was nominated for a Latin Grammy in 2015.

Joel Kelsey is a freelance double bassist, bass guitarist, and educator living in Silver Spring,

Maryland. Kelsey received his Bachelor of Music in Jazz Studies from Indiana University in 2004, and his Master of Music in Jazz Studies from the University of Illinois in 2011. Joel studied with David Baker and Bruce Bransby at Indiana University, and Larry Gray at the University of Illinois. Joel has performed with artists such as David Baker, Jon Faddis, Bobby Shew, Conrad Herwig, Dana Hall, The Chicago Jazz Orchestra, and Darius Brubeck.

SHARE MONTHLY FOOD CONTRIBUTIONS - Remember to bring your canned and dry food donations to the Narthex **Sunday, March 1**. We deliver the contributions to SHARE. Canned fruit (peaches, pineapple, fruit cocktail, mandarin oranges), cereal/oatmeal, diced/stewed/whole canned tomatoes, snacks/granola bars/crackers, Ramen noodles, jelly/jam, vegetable oil (24 oz, 48 oz), bagged rice (2 lb.), coffee (drip, instant), tea, condiments (mayo, ketchup, mustard), canned meat (chicken/spam).

Personal Care: laundry detergent (32 – 50 oz), toilet paper (>250 sheets/roll), Diapers (size 5, 6), feminine hygiene (panty liners -> maxi pads) (14 - 18 ct), baby wipes, flushable wipes, deodorant.

Share currently has ample supplies of gravy packets, stuffing, canned yams, cranberry sauce, canned tuna, pasta, tomato sauce, canned green bean and canned black beans. Share would welcome reusable shopping bags as well as paper shopping bags (grocery or clothing retail) with intact handles. **Please no open or out-of-date products.**
