


United Orphanage & Academy in Moi's Bridge (UOA), Kenya provides a home for 50 children and a school for more than 200 students from the orphanage and community in grades K-8th grade. Lewinsville Presbyterian Church, along with Westminster Presbyterian Church and Old Presbyterian Meeting House (both in Alexandria) are the primary sources of funding for UOA and collaborate in providing overall direction and policy guidance. In addition to housing, meals, clothing, medical care, and education for resident orphans, UOA strives to improve the educational opportunities for all of its academy students and financially assist orphans who attend vocational schools or higher education institutions after secondary school (there are 12 orphans currently in colleges and universities). A visit to LPC by the UOA Director, and possibly by one of the orphans who recently graduated from college, is anticipated in the Fall of 2020. MARCH WORK DAY WITH LOCAL HABITAT AFFILIATE – Want to help LPC respond to human need and be part of building a community of justice? Tune up for Summer Mission Project?
