**From the Confirmation Class: "Give Generously to the Pentecost Special Offering!"** - Lewinsville Presbyterian Church will receive

The Pentecost Offering **May 31**. A gift to the Pentecost Special Offering strengthens collaboration with churches and mission partners. The Pentecost Offering goes to support both efforts at the local level, as well as at the denominational level.

The 2020 Confirmation Class at Lewinsville has voted to dedicate our local 40% of the Pentecost Offering this year to help Serve Family Shelter (located in Manassas, a homeless shelter for families), and Shelter House (doing emergency shelter work with families). The website for Serve Family Shelter is <https://www.nvfs.org/our-services/homelessness-housing/serve-campus/>. With 92 beds, SERVE Family Shelter is Northern Virginia's largest family homeless shelter. On average, more than 40 percent of shelter guests are children. Shelter guests stay an average of 36 days, and during that time, work with a case manager who helps connect them with the right tools, knowledge and resources for lasting well-being and self-sufficiency. The remaining 60% of the offering is used to support children-at-risk, youth, and young adults through ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency.
