Shredding Document Destruction Program - As part of our clean-up and preparation for the construction at the church we are having a shredding company come on site to shred confidential and financial documents. The project team would like to present this as an opportunity to the entire congregation to bring household records they would like destroyed in a verified confidential fashion to the church and we will oversee the destruction of the documents.

The destruction is necessary as part of the project, but the opportunity for wider participation is a service to the congregation. If anyone would like to make a free-will offering to help offset the cost of the shredding we would welcome a modest donation(\$5-\$10).

We will limit the amount of material we can take. To give you an idea, it will be up to 3 bankers boxes per household.

The materials for destruction must be at the church by **Friday July 10**. You can bring the material any time before July 10th. The times for drop-off are weekdays 9:30-11:30 am. Sandy will be in the office on weekday mornings. The material will be stored in the Chapel until Tuesday, July 14, when the shredding will take place. We need an early count of how much we will have to have destroyed so that we can alert the shredding company. They base the time needed to be here on the volume of paper.

Following are the Do's and Don'ts of shredding. Please read this over and organize your material before bringing it to the church, using paper bags or cardboard/banker's boxes. Thank You.
