Chris Ziemba is a jazz pianist, composer, and educator based on the East Coast. He holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music and The Juilliard School. In 2016, Ziemba released his debut album, *Manhattan Lullaby*. The album features his original compositions and arrangements. In 2017, Ziemba became the pianist for the Airmen of Note, the premier jazz ensemble of the United States Air Force Band based in Washington, D.C.

Eric Juberg, 26, is a New York based jazz saxophonist and clarinetist. An Indiana native, Eric recently graduated from the Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music. While there he studied saxophone with Tom Walsh, as well as acclaimed jazz clarinetist Frank Glover. He can be heard on "Afro Blue" off of Michael Spiro and Wayne Wallace's Grammy nominated album "Canto America." In addition to sax and clarinet, Eric spends lots of time working with wind synthesizers, specifically the Akai Electronic Wind Instrument (EWI).

Kevin Cerovich is a Latin Grammy nominated trombonist originally from Kansas City, Missouri. He holds a Bachelor of Music in Jazz Trombone from the University of Missouri Kansas City. Cerovich's debut album, "The Last Spring" features his quartet playing all original compositions. Since 2013, Cerovich has played jazz trombone with the famed Airmen of Note, The United States Air Force Band, Washington, D.C. His work with Andres Salguero was nominated for a Latin Grammy in 2015.

Tom Holtz is a former member of "The President's Own" United States Marine Band in Washington, DC.

Tom is a frequent recording artist, having made several CD's with the Bayfield Brass Quintet, the Beltway Brass Quintet, and Off Bass Brass. An Illinois native, Holtz received

his Bachelor of Music degree in 1991 from Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona.

A native of Yuma, Arizona, **Joe Herrera** studied trumpet at Mesa Community College and Arizona State University and at the School for Improvisational Music. He has become an in demand musician winning the 2011 “Jazzie” for Best Trumpet Player and DC Mayors Arts Council Award and multiple “Whammy’s” for his work. Herrera has also been featured twice on NPR’s Tiny Desk Concert. He also is an active Music Mentor for The Washington Performing Arts Society and mentors inner-city kids on brass music.

Kelton Norris, from Raleigh, Mississippi, is a DC-based drummer and music educator that currently teaches at several locations across the tri-state area, such as Sidwell Friends School and Shepherd University. Kelton had the pleasure of competing in the D.C. Prix which is an international jazz competition presented by the D.C. Jazz Festival. The group was awarded first place. He obtained his undergraduate degree from the University of Southern Mississippi and his Masters in Music from Northern Illinois University.
