## Psalm 24 Bingo!

Read Genesis 1:20-25. Talk about what it says.	When you brush your teeth next, turn off the water while you are brushing.	Take a shower that is one minute shorter than usual.	Google the nearest recycling center to where you live. Find one item to bring you aren't currently recycling.	Pick one item that is part of your next meal. Imagine all the steps that went into you having that item to eat.
Ask your parent about how trash and recycling pick-up works where you live and where it goes next.	Watch Video #1 below on kids and plastic in the oceans.	Read Psalm 104: 24-25 Talk about what it says.	Research one product made out of recycled materials or a company that creates those products.	Make an art project, maybe a cross, out of recycled toilet paper rolls, egg crates, cardboard, or things like that.
Visit Weblink #2 below, the Lego Recycling website, and notice how many pounds have been recycled.	Unplug something you are not using right now, like toaster or coffee maker (but check with parent first!)	<b>Free Space</b>	Eat leftovers for a snack or a meal	Read about Earth Overshoot day on Weblink #3 below and learn what that phrase means
Put a reusable water bottle in your car so you will have it the next time you go out.	Read Job 12:7-10 Talk about what it says.	Think of one thing your family can do to help the environment.	Say a prayer thanking God for the earth and all that lives in it.	Find a recipe for a no-meat meal that you can help cook for your family this week.
Walk around where you live and turn off a light that is on but not needed.	Ask your parent about turning your thermostat down or up one degree (down if heat, up if A/C)	Watch Video #5 below on the history of Earth Day.	Read Nehemiah 9:6 Talk about what it says.	If you live near trees, try to identify one bird and one kind of tree near you.
