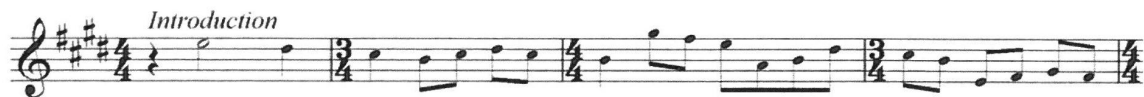

Calvin Hampton (1938 – 1984) was a leading American organist and sacred music composer. A graduate of Oberlin Conservatory and Syracuse University, his “Fridays at Midnight” organ recital series in NYC, was one of the most famous and popular organ recital series in American history. Hampton died of complications from AIDS at age 45.
