Samuel Coleridge-Taylor

To honor Black History Month Lewinsville's Music Ministry will be performing works of African American composers throughout the month.

Moses Hogan (1957-2003) was born in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was a graduate of

the New Orleans Center for Creative Arts (NOCCA), Oberlin Conservatory of Music in Ohio and he also studied at New York's Juilliard School of Music and Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge. Throughout his life, he created a number of new original arrangements of classic spirituals and formed several choirs such as the Moses Hogan Singers and the Moses Hogan Chorale. He also served as editor of the Oxford Book of Spirituals.

William Lawrence (1895-1981) a Harlem pianist and composer, accompanied such singers as Roland Hayes, Marian Anderson, and Dorothy Maynor. During the Depression, he and Alfred Ross formed the Symphonetta orchestra to put musicians to work. The ensemble played in many New York concert halls. He is credited with arranging "Let Us Break Bread Together," a spiritual closely associated with Marian Anderson.

Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, (1875-1912), was an Afro-English composer who enjoyed considerable acclaim during the turn of the 20th century. In 1890, Coleridge-Taylor began studies at the Royal College of Music. Originally studying the violin, he switched to composition under the tutelage of Charles Villiers Stanford. By the late 1890's, and with Edwards Elgar's support, his compositions became commonplace concert repertoire. One of Coleridge-Taylor's most famous works, the cantata "Hiawatha's Wedding Feast," based on poetry by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, became one of the most popular choral works of its time in England, rivaling Handel's "Messiah" and Mendelssohn's "Elijah." He toured in America three times and two public schools in the United States (one in Louisville, Kentucky, and one in Baltimore, Maryland) were named after him.

From the 175th Anniversary Notebook - When the original white clapboard church was disassembled in the fall of 1955 to make way for a new sanctuary, a few pieces of its supporting structure were found to be free of termites, and thus, were put aside for a future unknown use. For 47 years, the beams rested in the basement of the old manse, Elder Stan Grimm discovered them one day and decided they should have a new purpose. He crafted a cross from the saved beams and donated it to the church where it was installed near the front entrance in 2002. Regrettably, the roughhewn cross succumbed to termite damage and was replaced in 2010. Again, pieces of the original cross were saved and used as emblazoned enhancements on the arms of the new cross.

LENTEN EXPERIENCE - If you are interested in learning more about Pastor Layne's former Congregation, Hagar's Community Church – a Church planted on the inside of the largest Women's prison in Washington State, plan to join us this Lent as we read through *Fury and Grace; Forty Days of Paintings and Poetry From Prison*, a Lenten Devotional written by the Congregants of Hagar's Community Church. We will meet weekly on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 via zoom to discuss the book and to hear stories and lessons from Pastor Layne that she gleaned from her time with Hagar's Community Church.

This Lenten guide invites you to walk with members of Hagar's Community Church – a church behind bars – and to walk with Jesus who knows what it is like to be arrested, rejected, and despised. The Lewinsville Retirement Residence (LRR) opened in 1980 as an independent senior living facility formed by the members of Lewinsville Presbyterian Church. LRR provides a safe, secure, affordable residence to compassionately meet the needs of elderly persons without regard to their racial, social, ethnic, political, or religious backgrounds. LRR includes 161 apartments housing 175 residents, and all residents receive some rental subsidy. The Church provides on-going support to the residents through meal program subsidies, transportation services to worship, quarterly on-site worship services, and recreational and educational programs. The Church congregation performs needed small jobs for residents on Good Samaritan Days and attends the Lewinsville Retirement Residence annual meeting.
