



**FROM THE 175<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY NOTEBOOK** - In 1891, Mrs. Henry Pierce Viles, a Georgetown artist and active member of Washington's Fourth Presbyterian Church and close friend to Lewinsville pastor Rev. William H. Edwards came out to visit and spoke at an evening meeting of the congregation. Not long after her visit, she presented Lewinsville with an engraved silver baptismal bowl, and a complete communion service, including two bread trays, two goblets and a flagon. Her gifts are still in use today and adorn the communion table every time the Sacrament is served. There is no record of the congregation showing its appreciation for her visit with an appropriate gift.

*Celebrating 175 Years of Service and Ministry—1846-2021*

To honor Black History Month Lewinsville's Music Ministry will be performing works of African American composers throughout the month. As part of Lewinsville's mission, may we continue to promote and engage with underrepresented and underserved populations.

**Margaret Bonds** (1913–1972) was mentored by Florence Price, with whom she studied piano and composition. In 1933, Bonds performed Price's Piano Concerto with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra during the World's Fair; with this performance, she holds the distinction of being the first African-American woman to perform as a soloist with a major American orchestra. In 1939, Bonds moved to New York and became an important figure in the artistic scene in Harlem. Her close friendship with Langston Hughes led to many of her celebrated vocal compositions, such as the choral work *The Ballad of the Brown King*, "*The Negro Speaks of Rivers*" (1941), and the songs collected under the title *Three Dream Portraits* (1959).

**Lena McLin** (1928-): Her uncle, Thomas A. Dorsey, is known as the father of gospel music. Rev. Dr. McLin is the recipient of the Chicago Music Awards 2003 Lifetime Achievement award and the Human Symphony's Foundation living legends award honoree in 2007 and She has been awarded honorary degrees from Virginia Union University and Spelman College.

**William Dawson** (1899-1990) was a composer and choral director. Dawson developed the music program at the Tuskegee Institute. His famed 'Tuskegee Singers' choir headlined across the world and was the first black choir to sing at Constitution Hall. His Spiritual arrangements are major parts of the Western choral canon and his legacy continues through the "Golden Voices Choir" at the Tuskegee Institute.

Kathryn Morgan, our new Soprano section leader, is currently a General Music Teacher and Music Therapist at Laurel Ridge Elementary School in Fairfax, Virginia. Kathryn is currently in her first year singing with the Voce Chamber Singers. Kathryn graduated from James Madison University in 2020 with a B.M in Music Education with a minor in Special Education. While at JMU she was a member of their premier choral ensemble, The Madison Singers and served as the soprano choral scholar at Emmanuel Episcopal Church in Harrisonburg, Va. Kathryn is so excited to be joining the Lewinsville Presbyterian Church's Music Ministry.

Zachary Gutierrez, our new bass section leader, received his B.M in Voice Performance and Choral Conducting at The Hartt School of Music in West Hartford, CT. Opera performance credits include Papageno in Mozart's *The Magic Flute*, David in Barber's *A Hand of Bridge*, Jupiter in Offenbach's *Orpheus in the Underworld*, Aeneas in Purcell's *Dido and Aeneas* and George Jones in Weill's *Street Scene*. Choral soloist credits include Bass Soloist for Handel's *Messiah* and Haydn's *Paukenmesse*. He was also featured as a conductor for a performance of Bruckner's *Ave Maria* with the Hartt School Chamber Choir at the Connecticut Music Educator's Association Conference in 2016 and as an opera scenes conductor with Hartt Opera Theatre.

**2022 SALZMAN LECTURE - DR. CHARLES CHAVIS, JR.**  
**"HIDDEN IN FULL VIEW: CONFRONTING THE LEGACY OF  
RACISM IN THE AGE OF FRACTURE"**  
**TONIGHT, SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 20 7:00 P.M. ON ZOOM**

Dr. Chavis is the Founding Director of the John Mitchell, Jr. Program for History, Justice, and Race at George Mason University's Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter School for Peace and Conflict Resolution. He is also an Assistant Professor of Conflict Analysis and Resolution and History and serves as Director of GMU's African and African American Studies program.

He is a historian and museum educator whose work focuses on the history of racial violence and civil rights activism and Black and Jewish relations in the American South, and the ways in which the historical understandings of racial violence and civil rights activism can inform current and future approaches to peacebuilding and conflict resolution throughout the world.



**Helping to lead the discussion Dr. Chavis will be joined by the Rev. Terrance M. McKinley**

Rev. Terrance M. McKinley is the Director of Campaigns and Mobilizing at Sojourners. He currently serves on the ministerial staff at Reid Temple AME Church where he launched the Moral Agenda Summit hosted at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C. and helped design and launch the congregation's Commission on Social Action. He is an Alum of Cornell University in Ithaca, New York, where he earned his bachelor's degree and holds Honors, and of Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, N.J., where he earned his Master of Divinity Degree.
