From the 175th Anniversary Notebook - Our church was only eleven years old in 1857 when Rev. C.B McKee recorded in his diary one Sunday evening: "The Session met at my house this morning to consult about Platt Crocker (town drunk) . . . Nothing was done in the Crocker case; Platt was not present. Preached this morning at Lewinsville and this afternoon at Falls Church. In the evening I went to the Methodist Chapel, heard Mr. Dixon preach from Numbers 32:23. Went home with Mr. (Miles) Munson. Thought nothing but little of Dixon." A week later McKee preached at Lewinsville from 1 Corinthians 11:23-26, and noted in his diary: "Largest congregation yet." Before the Civil War broke out, the congregation had grown from the original seventeen members to eighty-three under McKee's leadership.
