From the 175th Anniversary Notebook - In the early 20th century, the Lewinsville community was showing signs of commercial progress and might have become the center of commerce for the area had the railroad not come to town. The Great Falls and Old Dominion Railroad opened in 1906, connecting Georgetown with Great Falls—and locals loved it. The railroad was electric! The post offices at Langley and Lewinsville were soon closed and a new one opened in rapidly growing McLean. The railroad itself folded in 1934 with the acceptance of another major advance in transportation technology—the automobile. The automobile brought down the railroad but was the stimulus for a giant leap into the modern era for Lewinsville Presbyterian Church.

BOOKS FOR FREE - Our new library does not have room for all the books from our old library. Some of them are on display today on tables in the Narthex or in the new library. If you see a book or two that are of interest to you please feel free to take it home with you at no cost.



PENTECOST OFFERING - On Pentecost Sunday, June 5, we will receive the Pentecost Offering during worship. This is one of four special offerings of the PC(USA). Forty percent of the Pentecost Offering is directed to assist children at risk in our local community and is designated by our church Mission and Service Ministry Group and the Session. The remaining sixty percent is distributed at the national and international levels toward child advocacy (10%), youth ministry (25%), and Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) opportunities (25%). The forty percent that will stay in our local area we

have designated to go toward the Young Adult Volunteer Program that is supported by National Capital Presbytery. The Young Adult Volunteer Program is a dear program to Pastor Layne who served as the New Orleans YAV Site Coordinator for 7 years. Please give generously as you are able.
