From the 175th Anniversary Notebook - The first evidence of Lewinsville's participation in an old-fashioned camp meeting is found in an entry by Rev. C.B. McKee in his personal diary, dated September 3, 1857. McKee records he was invited to accompany another Lewinsville member and his family to the site of the latest camp meeting. "There were many tents fitted out with neat bedsteads, bedding and carpets as though the people were to remain there the rest of their lives. I heard Rev. Mr. Brown of Georgetown preach from Ecclesiastes 12:1." McKee did not remain overnight. It is unclear how long the camp meeting continued but many such meetings consumed an entire week. Camp meetings were common among protestant congregations in the early 19th century, particularly in rural, undeveloped areas. Lewinsville and McLean certainly fit that category.

PATHWAYS OUT OF POVERTY – EASING RE-ENTRY FOR THE CONVICTED AND INCARCERATED -- Zoom Panel Discussion, TODAY 3:30-5:00pm -

Lewinsville’s Faith and Public Policy (F&PP) Committee is partnering with Redeemer Lutheran Church of McLean and the Tysons InterFaith coalition to sponsor a series of virtual panel discussions on “Pathways Out of Poverty in Northern Virginia.”

The goal of panel discussions is to build understanding about the challenges that our less fortunate neighbors face in improving their livelihoods, and to explore policies, programs, and individual actions that can help improve their lives.

This fourth event of the series will examine ways to ease re-entry back into society and the workforce for the convicted and incarcerated. The event will draw on the experiences and knowledge of panelists from the Virginia State Crime Commission, the Virginia Coalition Against Human Trafficking (VCAHT) and Opportunities, Alternatives and Resources (OAR/NOVA) a local organization working to rehabilitate those caught up in the justice system.
