

POSTLUDE Improvisation on "We Shall Overcome" Carl Haywood

Today's Call to Worship and Prayer of Confession are adapted with permission from the Presbyterian Church (USA) Peacemaking Program.

In Matthew 25:40 Jesus teaches that we serve Him when we serve the most vulnerable, "the least of these," who are members of His family. Increased racial injustice and widening economic disparity in our country reveal there is work to be done. At its September 2020 meeting, Lewinsville's Session voted to join several hundred other Presbyterian churches undertaking this work as part of the "Matthew 25 Initiative" of the Presbyterian Church (USA) for dismantling structural racism. Below are notes on music and composers performed for this morning's worship service.

In the winter of 1932, while on the road performing, **Thomas A. Dorsey** (1899-1993) received word of the death of his wife, Nettie, in childbirth, with the newborn dying the next day. The experience so transformed Dorsey creatively and spiritually, that legend has it that he composed his most famous gospel song, *Take My Hand Precious Lord* during a mourning service that very week. It was **Martin Luther King Jr.'s** (1929-1968) favorite song, and at his request, **Mahalia Jackson** (1911-1972) sang it at his funeral in April 1968.

It was right at the turn of the last century in which James Weldon Johnson (1871-1938) wrote the poem *Lift Every Voice and Sing* and brother John Rosamond Johnson (1873-1954) later set those words to music. James Weldon Johnson was principal of the Stanton School in Jacksonville, Florida when 500 of his students first recited the poem (in 1900) as part of a commemoration ceremony honoring the late President Abraham Lincoln (1809-1865). Often referred to as the Negro National Anthem, its univeral themes of liberation, persevarance and faith enable us to reflect on our shared history while at the same time encouraing us all to become agents of social justice and social change.

In 1957, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. visited Highlander Folk School in Tennessee. Part of the school's mission was to help prepare civil rights workers to challenge unjust laws and racist policies that discriminated against African Americans. The school also made a point of bringing Black and White people together to share experiences and to learn from each other. Dr. King delivered the main speech that day, honoring the school's 25th anniversary. As part of the meeting, folk singer **Pete Seeger** (1919-2014) got up with his banjo to play a tune. Later that day, Dr. King found himself humming the tune in the car. "There's something about that song that haunts you," he said to his companions. *We Shall Overcome* and other protest songs provided the soundtrack to the Civil Rights Movement. "We'll Overcome" first appeared as a protest song during a 1945–1946 labor strike against American Tobacco in Charleston, South Carolina where African American women strikers seeking a pay raise to 30 cents an hour sang as they picketed. Pete Seeger, the nationally known folk singer, revised the lyrics from "We will" to "We shall."

Widely regarded as the father of gospel music, **Thomas A. Dorsey's** (1899-1993) composing talent became a merging point in the early '20s, for many musical styles. In actual fact, his first musical impact was as a blues stylist as both writer and performer. Raised in Georgia, he attended a Baptist Convention in Chicago in 1922 and was so moved by the musical preacher he heard that night that he had a conversion experience, coining the term, 'Gospel Music,' and writing his very first gospel song all within a week. He was honored so often with honorary doctorates that he came to be known as Dr. Thomas A. Dorsey.

Rollo Dilworth (1970-) from St. Louis, Missouri, is Associate Professor of Choral Music Education and Chair of the Music Education Department at Temple University's Esther Boyer College of Music and Dance in Philadelphia, PA.

Carl W. Haywood (1949-) a native of Portsmouth, Virginia, is a graduate of Norfolk State University, Southern Methodist University, University of Southern California. Dr. Haywood, a dynamic advocate of NSU, is Director of Choral Activities and conducts the NSU Concert Choir and the Spartan Chorale. He also serves as a National Conductor for the 105 Voices of History, the Historically Black Colleges and Universities Choir.

The Reformed Institute (www.reformedinstitute.org) is sponsoring its annual Convocation on Saturday morning, January 28, at National Presbyterian Church. Mark Charles is a speaker, writer, and consultant, the son of an American woman (of Dutch heritage) and a Navajo man. He teaches the complexities of American history regarding race, culture, and Christendom in order to help forge a path of healing and conciliation for the nation. He is the co-author, with Soong-Chan Rah, of the book, *Unsettling Truths: The Ongoing, Dehumanizing Legacy of the Doctrine of Discovery*.
