POSTLUDE Jubilate Fela Sowande

To honor Black History Month Lewinsville's Music Ministry will be performing works of African American composers throughout the month.

Florence Price (1887-1953) was the first black female composer to have a symphony performed by a major American orchestra when the Chicago Symphony Orchestra played the world premiere of her Symphony No. 1 in E minor in 1933. She was trained at the New England Conservatory of Music and was a Professor at Shorter College in Arkansas. She married a prominent civil rights attorney and returned to Little Rock, but racial violence — including a lynching in 1927 — caused her family to move to Chicago. Price composed over 300 works for orchestra, piano, organ, voice, and more during her prolific career. Her music brings together the European classical tradition in which she was trained and the haunting melodies of African American spirituals and folk tunes.

Fela Sowande (1905-1987) was a prominent Nigerian composer, organist, and educator. Son of an minister, Sowande trained in music first under his father and as a chorister at Christ Church

Cathedral in Lagos, Nigeria before moving to London in 1935. He supported himself by playing jazz in nightclubs, eventually incorporating this style into his recording and composing career. As an educator, Sowande taught at the University of Ibadan, Howard University, and the University of Pittsburgh; he wrote texts on the music of Yoruban culture.

Sowande's named "Jubliate" demonstrates his synthesis of elements of African musical traditions, especially those of Yoruba music, with European classical composition techniques. The piece forms part of the suite "The Sacred Idioms of the Negro," which is based entirely on melodies from Yoruban hymns. The main tune of "Jubilate" is derived from a hymn entitled "Oyigyigi I'Olorun wa" (Our God Is Immortal), derived itself from a traditional Yoruban song for the river goddess Osun; this melody is accompanied with a rhythmic ostinato in the pedal.

David Hurd (1950-) holds degrees from Oberlin Conservatory and UNC. Dr. Hurd was Professor of Sacred Music and Director of Chapel Music at the General Theological Seminary, New York City, for 39 years. He is presently the Director of Music at the Church of St. Mary the Virgin in Times Square, New York City. Hurd's sacred compositions can be found in many hymnals. Hurd was awarded First Prize in Organ and Improvisation at the International Congress of Organists in Philadelphia (1977).

Hurd's "Teach me O Lord" uses an 8 measure repeating pattern in the organ, setting a strong 'heartbeat' foundation as we follow God's 'statutes.' The piece ends with aleatoric (from the Latin word *alea*, meaning "dice" - music in which an element of the music is left to chance and improvisation in the performer) singing by the choir.
