Catherina Pratten

To honor Women's History Month, Lewinsville's Music Ministry will be performing works of female composers throughout the month. As part of Lewinsville's mission, may we continue to promote and empower women.

Emilia Giuliani (1813-1850) was the daughter of famed Italian virtuoso, Mauro Giuliani. Sadly for Emilia, by the time she launched her own career, interest in the guitar had waned and she struggled to emulate the success of her father. As a composer, her work only superficially resembles her father's. Even in his most extended and adventurous pieces Mauro stays within the

harmonic and formal boundaries of Viennese classicism. Emilia, however, explores the outer reaches of her singular harmonic imagination with a fresh and daring disrespect for convention. Her Sei Preludi op.46 is a unique contribution to the classical guitar repertoire. Her abrupt modulations to distant keys, chromaticism and adventurous use of dissonance are highly individual additions to the sound world of the romantic guitar. These characteristics are notably evident in the Sei Preludi in which Emilia takes specific ideas- a melody, arpeggio or technique- and develops them in thrillingly inventive ways. In addition to the preludes, ten other pieces by Emilia have survived: six Belliniani; arrangements of excerpts from operas by Vincenzo Bellini (1801-1835), mimicking Mauro's similar treatment of Rossini in his celebrated Rossiniane, and four sets of variations, based on themes from popular Italian operas. Kathleen Thomerson (1934-) studied music at the University of Texas, Syracuse University, as well overseas with noted organists, Flor Peeters and Jean Langlais. She worked as the music director of University United Methodist Church in St. Louis, and taught organ at the Saint Louis Conservatory. As a writer of hymns, Thomerson is best known for the text "I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light", written in the summer of 1966 after a visit to the Church of the Redeemer in Houston, and set to her own tune, Houston.

A native of Lawrence, Kansas, **Margaret Burk** (1990-) is currently Assistant Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wis. In demand as a clinician, she recently conducted the Virginia All-State Treble Choir (April 2022) and has appeared as a faculty member at the Montreat Conference on Music and Worship (Montreat, NC) and the Royal School of Church Music King's College Course (Wilkes-Barre, PA).

The story behind "Be Thou My Vision" begins with St. Patrick. When he was just 16 years old, pirates kidnapped Patrick and sold him into slavery in Ireland. This caused him to enter adulthood knowing the Gaelic language and Irish customs. He also became a Christian during this time. Years later, he managed to escape and return home to his family in England. While most would've stayed home forever, Patrick chose to go back to Ireland and become a missionary. On Easter Sunday in 433, the local Irish king issued a decree in observation of a pagan Druid festival that prohibited anyone from lighting a flame or candle. Patrick, refusing to honor anyone but Christ, stood against the king. That morning, Patrick risked his life by climbing to the tallest hill in the area and lighting a huge fire. As the ancient Irish people woke up, they could all see Patrick's defiance of the king. He could not hide his light. Patrick wanted to show the world that God's light shines in darkness, and that only He deserves praise.Years later, an unknown composer wrote a melody in honor of Patrick's heroism. Called, "Slane," the now-forgotten composer named it after the hill where Patrick shined his light: Slane Hill. People still recognize the tune today.

'Be Thou My Vision's' Irish text is sometimes attributed to Saint Dallan Forgaill (c. 530–598), a beloved Irish poet who was martyred by pirates while serving at the monastery of Inniskeel, Donegal, **Mary Byrne (1880–1931)** transcribed and translated the ancient manuscripts from early-middle English. Mary Byrne's translation was adapted by **Eleanor Hull (1860–1935)**, a venerable Irish scholar, and first published in her 'Poem Book of the Gael.'

Catherina Pratten (1821-1895) was born in Germany and began playing guitar at a very early age under the instruction of her father, Ferdinand Pelzer. By the age of seven she was performing in public and in 1829 her family relocated to London where she became a sensation, playing multiple concerts with fellow child prodigy Giulio Regondi (1822-1872). By 1836 he had established herself as one of the preeminent performers and teachers in London and had as her students many members of society, including a granddaughter of Queen Victoria. She married celebrated flautist Robert Sidney Pratten in 1854, his death in 1868 caused her to retreat from musical life for a few years; she returned to the concert stage in 1871 with a performance of Mauro Giuliani's Guitar Concerto No.3. Pratten was a prolific composer; many of her around 200 pieces were written for her students and self-published under the name Mme. Sidney Pratten.

The guitar used in today's service is a replica of a Romantic guitar built by Swiss luthier Maurice Ottiger. This guitar is modelled on the instruments of French luthier René Pierre Lacôte (1785-1868) whose guitars were endorsed by players such as Fernando Sor, Ferdinando Carulli, and Napoléon Coste. It is sometimes claimed that Lacôte's guitars fall somewhere between the Spanish-and Viennese-style guitars of the era, but it would be more accurate to say that Lacôte's instruments reflect the early to mid-19th century French guitars made in Mirecourt, a center of French instrument making located near France's eastern border with Germany.
