

A note on the Traditional New Orleans Jazz Funeral and Celebration of Life and Resurrection:

Though funerals would seem an unlikely source for such a festive tradition, the jazz funeral celebrates life at the moment of death. A Jazz funeral (also called a Second Line) has its cultural roots in New Orleans. When people die in New Orleans the streets are filled with music – which is a celebration of the person's life as much as a mourning of his or her death. A typical jazz funeral begins at a church or funeral home and leads the way to the cemetery. Mourners are joined by a brass band that plays music that starts off heavy and sad (the 1st line). It is customary to that the band plays very slowly a dirge, or an old spiritual such as 'Nearer My God to Thee." But on the return from the cemetery, the band strikes up a rousing tune like 'When the Saints Go Marching In,' or a ragtime song such as 'Didn't He Ramble.' The funeral turns celebratory and everyone in attendance dances! When the deceased is laid to rest – or said differently once they have "cut the body loose" – the mourners "cut loose" as well. As long as you're respectful, passersby are encouraged to join in and help celebrate. The second line is a joyous celebration of hope as the crowd celebrates the resurrection of the deceased.
