Theme for 2023-2024 Year: "Sent From the Heart of God"

Last year, our congregation's activities were organized around the theme of the "Journey Into the Heart of God." God's heart is our true home, and the character of God's heart – merciful, kind, steady, relational, full of grace and justice, saturated with love – fills everything that we do as a congregation. God's heart is our true home, as the Psalms teach us: "Happy are all who take refuge in God" (Psalm 2:11).

God's heart is also a place of dynamism and action and mission. God's heart roots us in love, and then God sends us into the world to share that love with everyone that we meet. "Happy is everyone...who walks in God's ways" (Psalm 128:1). We are called to walk in God's ways, sent forth from the heart of God.

God's loving grace is poured forth upon all people, from the youngest among us to the oldest. It is for that reason that we are glad to welcome *children of all ages* to worship.

During the coming year, we will continue to ground everything that we do in the heart of God (i.e., we are not leaving God's heart), but we will be conscious of the ways that we are being sent forth from God's heart into the world that God so loves. God's heart goes with us into the world. This theme has strong implications for our mission in the world, for our work of evangelism and spreading the good news of God's grace, and for the ways that the church's life together (our Fellowship) creates a community open to the world. We look forward to exploring this theme together, as we move forth into our local community and into our world.

TAIZÉ AND CONTEMPLATIVE LABYRINTH SERVICE SUNDAY JANUARY 7th AT 7:00 IN THE CHAPEL

Taizé worship comes to us from the Taizé Community, a Christian community of prayer, music, and hospitality in France. (You may read more about Taizé at https://www.taize.fr/en. Walking a labyrinth is an ancient practice that combines movement and meditation. It provides an opportunity to slow down, to reflect, and to open our hearts to divine insights. The labyrinth, with its twists and turns, mirrors the twists and turns of life, and as we navigate it, we find ourselves in a metaphorical journey of faith. This contemplative service will be combining these contemplative practices together. During this service everyone will be invited to walk the lighted labyrinth and discover their 2024 "Star Word." Epiphany, traditionally celebrated on January 6th, marks the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus. They followed a star to find God's revelation made real on earth. Music contains piano, flute, violin, guitar, and voice.



TODAY we have a special experience for members of Lewinsville to contemplate Epiphany. Everyone is invited to walk the lighted labyrinth and discover their 2024 "Star Word." Epiphany, traditionally celebrated on January 6th, marks the visit of the Magi to

the infant Jesus. They followed a star to find God's revelation made real on earth.

As you walk the illuminated labyrinth, its winding path can guide your thoughts towards the significance of Epiphany. The soft glow of the lights will create a tranquil atmosphere, allowing you to connect with the spiritual journey of the Magi and, in turn, your own journey of faith. At the heart of the labyrinth each person will

receive a "Star Word" – a word to help guide and inspire your spiritual life throughout the coming year.

Walking a labyrinth is an ancient practice that combines movement and meditation. It provides an opportunity to slow down, to reflect, and to open our hearts to divine insights. The labyrinth, with its twists and turns, mirrors the twists and turns of life, and as we navigate it, we find ourselves in a metaphorical journey of faith.

EXTENDED SERVING OF THE COMMUNION OF THE CHURCH - Today our Elders and Deacons will bring communion to those who are unable to be with us in worship. <u>The First Sunday of Each Month</u>, the deacons ask you to consider a donation to the Deacons Fund. The fund is used by the pastors to help address temporary difficulties faced by the Lewinsville community, which includes principally members of the congregation and residents of LLR and Chesterbrook. The deacons try to keep a balance of around \$5500 on hand. Your donations replenish the Fund. Occasionally, if and when the funds significantly exceed \$5500, the deacons pass some of the funds to the Lewinsville Mission and Service Committee to support their important work with partner organizations locally and overseas. Cash and check donations are received in the narthex after the worship service. Alternatively, donations can be made on the church website.

January 24 Holy Happy Hour, Herseth Family Trumpet and Organ Celebration — Join us for the January 24 Holy Happy Hour at 6:15pm featuring trumpeter, Joshua Kauffman. Lewinsville's very own Judith Herseth is an organist and also the daughter-in-law to world famous trumpeter Adolph "Bud" Herseth. January's Holy Happy Hour will celebrate the glory of trumpet and organ music and celebrate family ties. Adolph "Bud" Herseth was principal trumpet in the Chicago Symphony Orchestra from 1948 until 2001, and served as principal trumpet emeritus from 2001 until his retirement in 2004. Lewinsville welcomes Joshua Kauffman, lead trumpet chair of The U.S. Army Blues, the premiere jazz ensemble of The United States Army to perform with Lewinsville's majestic pipe organ. Joshua regularly plays with the National Symphony, is a Yamaha Performing Artist, and an in-demand musician in all musical idioms.
