

A note on this morning's commissioned work.

**David Conte** (b. 1955) is the composer of over one hundred and fifty works. He lived and worked with Aaron Copland having received a Fulbright Fellowship for study with Copland's teacher Nadia Boulanger in Paris. He is Professor and Chair of the Composition Department at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. He has received the Raymond Brock commission from the American Choral Directors Association, one of the nation's highest honors in choral music. He is the American Guild of Organists 'Distinguished Composer of the Year' for 2024. Conte is a significant LGBTQ+ composer and leading compositional voice in America.

"Concert Suite" for Brass Quintet and organ was commissioned by the Donald Sinclair Sutherland Music Ministries Endowment Fund, Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church, Bethesda, Maryland. The present second and third movements were premiered on February 5th, 2011, at the Peabody Conservatory of Music, with organist Donald Sutherland and the C Street Brass Quintet: The first movement Prelude was added in 2023, commissioned by Lewinsville Presbyterian Church, McLean, Virginia, John Nothaft, Organist and Director of Music Ministries, in loving memory of Helen Martin. The complete threemovement suite was premiered on March 31st, 2024, at Lewinsville Presbyterian Church.

The first movement "**Prelude**" begins with a fluttering quasi-birdsong motif in the organ, accompanied by a chorale texture in the brass, which is interspersed with a chant-like motive in the trombone. The recitative character of the music steadily grows to stately and declamatory music at the pieces's climax.

The second movement "**Ostinato**" is a Passacaglia in F minor built on a three-measure bass line first stated in the organ pedal which includes all twelve tones of the chromatic scale. The mood of the movement is predominantly solemn and serious, though there is a recurring contrasting section based on a more lyrical, expressive theme. The variations on the ground bass become progressively more rhythmically animated, leading to a climax featuring the second melodic idea. The work ends solemnly.

The third movement, entitled **"Fanfare and Scherzo"** opens majestically and is built on a series of imitative entries in the brass with flourishes in the organ; this texture is reversed as the phrases unfold in this opening section. This gives way to a brief lyrical transition, leading to a sudden change of tempo to the Scherzo, which is an energetic and graceful Allegro dominated by fleeting triplets in all instruments. After rising to a climax, the opening music returns in a more rhythmically active texture, concluding with a brief return to the Scherzo music.

**<u>CHRIST IS RISEN, HE IS RISEN INDEED!</u>** At the dawn of the first Easter, an angel of the Lord descended from Heaven, stood by the empty tomb, and proclaimed, "He has been raised from the dead." As Easter breaks through, ending the season of Lent, the purple clouds of morning give way to the sun, symbolizing the light of the world.

In John 8:12, Jesus declared, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." Sunrise encompasses both the purple of Lent and the white of Easter, symbolizing Christ's triumph over death.

Alleluia! Praise the Lord for Christ's victory over death. The painting of the Cross, representing Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, incorporates many Easter symbols. The Madonna Lilies, native to Israel and the Middle East since ancient times, symbolize the Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, all fully God. In the background, lilies of the field and budding trees signify new life, while the purple clouds echo the dawn of Easter morning.

These beautiful banners, crafted by Michelle Witt Gottke for Easter 2024, serve as a reminder of the joyous resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.v

**EASTER SEASON SERMON SERIES: "LAMENT AS AN EASTER ACT OF HOPE"** During the last three weeks of April, we will have a 3-week sermon series on the biblical practice of *lament*. Lament is the practice of sharing our grief, our hurt, our complaints with God, in the confidence and hope that God will hear us and that our prayers will make a difference, urging God to bring about a change in our circumstances. Lament is a way of saying that the promises of God – promises of well-being, of shalom, of justice, of wholeness – have not yet been realized. We are urging God to make good on God's promises.

It is precisely because of our convictions about the resurrection that we find the confidence to take our concerns and our hurts to God in prayer. We join our biblical ancestors in taking our concerns directly to God, praying our way through our hurt, and drawing closer to God in the process.
