

SENT FROM THE HEART OF GOD

Theme for 2023-2024 Year: "Sent From the Heart of God"

Last year, our congregation's activities were organized around the theme of the "Journey Into the Heart of God." God's heart is our true home, and the character of God's heart – merciful, kind, steady, relational, full of grace and justice, saturated with love – fills everything that we do as a congregation. God's heart is our true home, as the Psalms teach us: "Happy are all who take refuge in God" (Psalm 2:11).

God's heart is also a place of dynamism and action and mission. God's heart roots us in love, and then God sends us into the world to share that love with everyone that we meet. "Happy is everyone...who walks in God's ways" (Psalm 128:1). We are called to walk in God's ways, sent forth from the heart of God.

God's loving grace is poured forth upon all people, from the youngest among us to the oldest. It is for that reason that we are glad to welcome *children of all ages* to worship.

This theme has strong implications for our mission in the world, for our work of evangelism and spreading the good news of God's grace, and for the ways that the church's life together (our Fellowship) creates a community open to the world. We look forward to exploring this theme together, as we move forth into our local community and into our world.

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF EACH MONTH, the deacons ask you to consider a donation to the Deacons Fund. The fund is used by the pastors to help address temporary difficulties faced by the Lewinsville community, which includes principally members of the congregation and residents of LLR and Chesterbrook. The deacons try to keep a

balance of around \$5500 on hand. Your donations replenish the Fund. Occasionally, if and when the funds significantly exceed \$5500, the deacons pass some of the funds to the Lewinsville Mission and Service Committee to support their important work with partner organizations locally and overseas. In the past month, the Deacon Fund has been used to help a neighbor facing eviction. Cash and check donations are received in the narthex after the worship service. Alternatively, donations can be made on the church website.

<u>Christ is Risen, He is Risen Indeed!</u> At the dawn of the first Easter, an angel of the Lord descended from Heaven, stood by the empty tomb, and proclaimed, "He has been raised from the dead." As Easter breaks through, ending the season of Lent, the purple clouds of morning give way to the sun, symbolizing the light of the world.

In John 8:12, Jesus declared, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." Sunrise encompasses both the purple of Lent and the white of Easter, symbolizing Christ's triumph over death.

Alleluia! Praise the Lord for Christ's victory over death. The painting of the Cross, representing Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, incorporates many Easter symbols. The Madonna Lilies, native to Israel and the Middle East since ancient times, symbolize the Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, all fully God. In the background, lilies of the field and budding trees signify new life, while the purple

clouds echo the dawn of Easter morning.
