Along this path, we will be transformed from the inside out, we will become agents of joy in our hurting world, and we will discover that each one of us belongs to God, now and forever. Let's embark on this journey together.







Welcome to our Guest Musician! Annelise Hartlage is a sophomore at James Madison High School in Vienna. Annelise is a member of the 2024-25 Potomac Organ Institute, an organ scholarship program sponsored by the Washington, D.C., area chapters of the American Guild of Organists. In previous summers, Annelise studied piano at Lutheran Summer Music, held at Valparaiso University, Valparaiso, Indiana, and attended the Pipe Organ Encounter at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. This summer, Annelise will study organ at the Interlochen Center for the Arts, Interlochen, Michigan. Apart from music, Annelise competes on her school debate team and is a member of the Student Government Association. Annelise also plays tennis (go Warhawks!), volunteers at church, and helps teach Korean language to elementary school students.

**To honor Women's History Month**, Lewinsville's Music Ministry will be performing works of female composers throughout the month. As part of Lewinsville's mission, may we continue to promote and empower women.

Widely performed throughout the country, the music of American composer **Gwyneth Walker** (1947-) is beloved by performers and audiences alike for its energy, beauty, reverence, drama, and humor. Dr. Gwyneth Walker is a graduate of Brown University and the Hartt School of Music. She holds B.A., M.M. and D.M.A. degrees in Music Composition. A former faculty member of the Oberlin College Conservatory, she resigned from academic employment in 1982 in order to pursue a career as a full-time composer. For nearly 30 years she lived on a dairy farm in Braintree, Vermont, before returning to live in her childhood hometown of New Canaan, Connecticut. Gwyneth Walker is a proud resident of New England. She was the recipient of the 2000 "Lifetime Achievement Award" from the Vermont Arts Council and the 2018 "Alfred Nash Patterson Lifetime Achievement Award" from Choral Arts New England.

**Dr. Mary Beth Bennett** (1954-) is an internationally recognized performer, composer and improviser living in Richmond, Virginia. She serves on the music faculty of the University of Richmond and is Organist of Second Baptist Church. Having previously held various positions in Washington, D.C., including at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and as Ceremonial Organist for the United States Government, she holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music, Stetson University, the Staatliche Hochschüle für Musik (Cologne, Germany), and the University of Southern California. The winner of numerous awards in performance and composition, she has received commissions in multiple genres from the American Guild of Organists, National Association of Pastoral Musicians, Association of Anglican Musicians, The Paul VI Institute for the Arts, Millennia Consort and various churches, chamber ensembles and private parties. She maintains a studio of improvisation students and has served as a judge for the AGO National Competition in Organ Improvisation. Active as a clinician in improvisation, she has presented seminars for the AGO, AAM, NPM as well as the Smithsonian Institution.
